Kindness is an incredibly powerful way to show we are united against COVID-19. You can make a huge difference by:

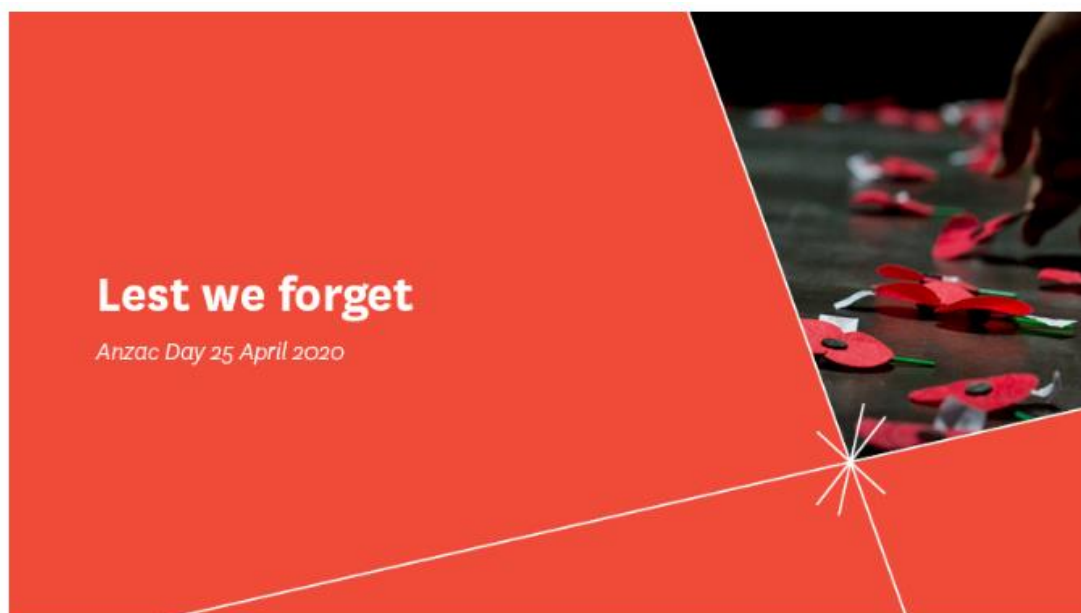
- checking in on older relatives or vulnerable people over the phone, to make sure they have everything they need
